HOMEMAKERS Community Recycling recently helped solve a local Primary School's storage problems by recycling an old wardrobe into some book storage facilities.

The donated items were redesigned into bookcases on wheels at a height that is practical for children and easy to move around the classroom.

The items were designed by Neil Davies (Homemakers Workshop Manager) and volunteers based at HMP Prescoed, and were recently presented to the school's After School Club.

Neil Davies of Homemakers who presented the items to the school said: "Homemakers is always looking for ways to recycle furniture and when the opportunity arose we were only too willing to help."
